My husband and I attended the New York State Covered Bridge Society Meeting in Syracuse, NY on Sunday, April 27, 2025, on our way home from a 3-week trip to the mid-west. I was asked to speak about VCBS, which I did. Twenty-one NYSCB members were there, including us and Clay and Jane Converse (life members of VCBS). We sold three 2026 calendars (yes, this early!) and gained one new VCBS member. It was fun.

On Tuesday, April 29, 2025, I attended the Vermont Tourism Summit in Burlington, VT. This is an annual event sponsored by VT Tourism Commission and 200+ businesses and organizations in the “tourist trade” were there. I applied for a scholarship and received \$100 which defrayed the cost by 40%. I made several good contacts, and I do expect this summit will pan out to be a worthwhile expenditure. In 2026, the Summit will be in Killington, VT so it will be much less hassle to get there. I’ve been invited to an evaluation luncheon on June 18, 2025, at Basin Harbor Club in Vergennes, at no cost. I plan to go to that and lobby hard for a stronger link between the VCBS and the VT Tourism Commission.

The trip to the Vermont Statehouse in Montpelier, which has been in the works for months, happened on Friday, May 2, 2025. Thirteen VCBS members were in the House of Representatives that day, including Rep. Alicia Malay and Rep. Jim Casey. Alicia introduced us and read the announcement of Governor Scott’s proclamation (signed on February 24, 2025) and declaration of Covered Bridge Week in Vermont, August 2 – 9, 2025. The 11 VCBS members in the balcony rose and were recognized by the 150 House members. It was

a memorable event to mark our 25th anniversary year!

Events Committee

On an unseasonably cool day in May, I am thinking ahead to what the weather might be during Covered Bridge Week in Vermont which is August 2 – 9, 2025. We may be wishing for some of the cold breezes we have today! But before I outline the events I know will happen in August, let me talk a bit about the 2025 VCBS Spring and Fall meetings. (The fairs and festivals we plan to attend are outlined in the Fundraising Report)

The Spring Meeting this year will be in Saxtons River, VT at Main Street Arts (former Odd Fellows Hall) on Saturday, June 7th. Meet and greet begins at 10 a.m. with the business meeting beginning in the theater upstairs at 10:30 sharp and lasting 75 – 90 minutes. (Yes, there is an elevator to 2nd level)

Lunch will be buffet style at noon in the dining room on the main floor. Afternoon activities will include recognition of VCBS life members, announcement of the

poster contest winner, group brainstorming session (30 minutes), Silent Auction and teacup raffle results (yes, one of each, but small), and an optional caravan to Hall, Worrall, and Bartonsville Covered Bridges, led by Phill Gatenby. It will be a full day, but a fun one! Please plan to come!

And if it's hot, there's air conditioning at Main Street Arts!

The VCBS Fall Meeting is set for Saturday, October 4 at the Weathersfield Town Offices. They have a large meeting space on the ground floor. There is ample parking, ADA-accessible entrance and restrooms, wi-fi, fully equipped kitchen, and plenty of space for meeting and eating. There will be a program at 1 p.m. I have it planned but will provide the details in the September newsletter. Caravan to local covered bridges will leave at 2:30 ish, as usual.

- Pittsford, VT Pittsford Day, noon to dark, VCBS booth at Rec Park and/or Gorham CB (Beth & Paul Limmer)

Sunday, August 3:

- Pop-up meet-up at one of the CBs in Stowe area where the New England Audi Rally to Covered Bridges (their 10th annual) will be stopping. They'll see 20 VT CBs in 2 days. (Email me if you want to join this rally. I'll give you the leader's contact info. Benefits a good cause.)

Monday, August 4:

- Maple Monday at local covered bridges. Beth and Paul will be at Brown CB in Shrewsbury with

Stewart Maple Products of Shrewsbury. Other pairs (1-2 VCBS members with a maple producer) may go to other CBs. This event is in the preliminary phase right now. Want to join? Email me.

Wednesday August 6:

- Town Library in Springfield, VT "Covered Bridges of Windsor County: Past and Present", begins at 1 p.m. A member of VCBS Speakers Bureau will field questions after the presentation.

Thursday, August 7:

- Brattleboro – Creamery Bridge: 6-8 p.m. Phill Gatenby's world premier film, "Windham County Covered Bridges", will be screened. Seating will be inside the Creamery Covered Bridge and ice cream will be served. This event is a collaboration between Brattleboro Parks and Recreation Dept and VCBS. There will be a banner on the covered bridge.

Friday, August 8:

- Brandon Farmer's Market, Central Park, Rt 7: 9:30 – 2:30, VCBS booth and banner saying: Celebrating...Covered Bridge Week..in Vermont. Sales, recruitment, and education, with a side of good humor, and tall tales, upon request.

Saturday, August 9:

- Cambridge Junction / Poland Covered Bridge in Jeffersonville: Dedication of the new plaque on the bridge to commemorate it being the impetus to the founding of VCBS in 2000, listing VCBS charter members, and sporting the VCBS logo. VCBS booth at the Artisans Fair on Main Street. Time: TBD
- Bennington's Bike to the Bridges: Gather at Monument Arts and Culture Center, 44 Gypsy Lane, at 9:30 a.m. Bikers leave at 10 a.m. (with escort vehicle for safety) to tour Silk Road, Paper Mill, and Burt Henry Covered Bridges. Free lunch served to all participants 12 – 1. (I submitted a grant to fund this event and will know by mid-June if it is awarded. If not, this event will not take place.)

There may be more events that are added to this list as time goes on. Other towns with covered bridges are planning what their community will do.

VCBS had a 10 ft x 2 ft banner designed in March. It is light blue heavy-duty vinyl with fade-resistant resin lettering in red which says: Celebrating.... Covered Bridge Week ...in Vermont. These are being offered to towns with covered bridge(s) for \$80 each. Fifteen banners have been sold thus far. Free delivery will be in June. Again, contact me if your town or business is interested or needs a photo of the banner. They are striking and can be used year after year. Did you think Covered Bridge Week in Vermont was a one-year only

event? Think again, my friends. It is the beginning of a trend, and soon to be a tradition!

All items for sale at the VCBS online store were reviewed and prices adjusted to reflect the ever-increasing cost of shipping and sales history. Several of the descriptions were edited. VCBS does not ship internationally, or to Hawaii or Alaska. This info was added to each listing to avoid potential confusion by shoppers. Some item prices were reduced. Love a sale? Head over to vermontbridges.org and select online store from the drop-down menu.

There's a new item in the online store: a thumb drive with 103 photos taken by John Knox, all of covered bridges in Vermont and many in the Springtime when the flowering trees are so pretty, as they are right now! This thumb drive is the perfect gift for folks that have digital photo frames. They can also be viewed on your computer. We set up the VCBS digital photo frame at inside venues so visitors can enjoy these fabulous images. We've sold some thumb drives to professionals to use in their waiting rooms. Very relaxing! Very Vermont-y!

The 2026 VCBS calendar is all done and will debut, as usual, at the Spring VCBS Meeting. Steve Brown of Farmington, NH did all the format work on the photos and that is the hardest part. This is the fourth year of making a calendar of covered bridges, all are in Vermont. It was decided by the FR Committee to raise the price from \$15 to \$18 per calendar. Cost of mailing is \$4 each if bought online, and each calendar must be mailed in its own envelope. Look for them at the online store in mid-June. Last year, a handful of people waited

too long to buy the 2025 calendar and missed out. Buy early!

Special thanks to Diane Sullivan of Poultney who does all the shipping of orders placed online, and by mail from the VCBS Marketplace, except for Joe Nelson's book which is shipped by Steve Miyamoto. Orders are fielded by Mark Maddox. It takes a village....

Bridges in the News

Sanborn Covered Bridge – Lyndon – Plans to restore the historic Sanborn bridge in Lyndon have been revised aimed at improving water flow under the bridge to reduce flooding. The plan calls for raising the bridge more than 4 feet. This allows for more water to flow under the bridge allowing flood waters to pass more freely, reducing the risk of damage to nearby roads.

Chamberline Covered Bridge – Lyndon – On May 5, 2025, Jeanne and Marcel Beaudry attended the Select Board meeting in Lyndonville to discuss public concerns regarding the Chamberlain Covered Bridge. Representatives from Hoyle, Tanner & Associates who had inspected the bridge in October of 2024 presented on the condition of the bridge. The bridge that had been built in 1881 and refurbished in 1980 was rated poor for the deck condition, fair for the superstructure condition and satisfactory for the substructure condition. Additional observations revealed rot, splits and breaks, rusted hardware, sagging and missing planks, all in various parts of the bridge.

Rehabilitation of the bridge is possible but would be a great deal of work. To fund rehabilitation, 80% of the money would be from Federal funds, 10% State funds, 10% Town funds. (If a temporary bridge is not needed during refurbishment, the state would pay 17.5% and the town 2.5%.) The timeline would start with a scoping report in the Fall of 2025, Contract Plans/Advertising in

the Summer of 2029 with construction beginning in 2031.

The audience in attendance who spoke were in favor of refurbishing the covered bridge and not removing it and replacing it with a metal and/or concrete one.

Salisbury Station / Cedar Swamp Creek / Creek Road Covered Bridge - Salisbury-Cornwall - This covered bridge was unfortunately lost due to fire on September 10, 2016. In 2022, the residents of Salisbury and Cornwall provided their input that an authentic covered bridge should be built to replace the original covered

bridge. The select board proceeded with that request with a targeted construction date in 2025. However, the current Chair of the Salisbury Select Board has

recently informed us that due to federal funding cuts the timeline for construction is now delayed to 2031.

Williamsville Covered Bridge – Newfane – On April 30, 2025, a large box truck driven by a Lowell Massachusetts driver struck the bridge causing significant damage. He fled the scene but was apprehended about half an hour later in Dover, VT. He was cited for leaving the scene of the accident as well as providing false report to law enforcement authorities. The driver is due in court on June 17 to answer the charges.

Miller's Run Covered Bridge – Lyndon – On March 21, 2025, the final phase to install headache bars at the

Miller's Run Covered Bridge was completed. An effort that was conceived almost 3 years ago to protect the 146 year-old span. The final pieces, the steel arches, were created by Momentum Manufacturing and by students from the Lyndon Institute welding and fabrication class. Total cost for the new barriers was estimated at \$60,000.
